- [1] Charitable Donations; Tax Credit Amounts (SB 1216) Increases the contribution limits for the Charitable Tax Credit from \$200 for an individual to \$400, and from \$400 for a married couple to \$800. Also separates out and creates a new tax credit for contributions to foster care charities with limits of \$500 for individuals and \$1,000 for married couples. Passed House 41-18. Passed Senate 23-6. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on May 6, 2016.
- [2] Charitable Tax Credit; Contribution Date (SB 1217) Extends the Charitable Tax Credit contribution deadline to April 15 from its current December 31 deadline. Passed House 52-1. Passed Senate 30-0. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on May 18, 2016.
- [3] Abortion Clinics; Medication Abortions (SB 1324) Requiring abortion providers to follow the Food and Drug Administration's medication abortion protocol as of December 31, 2015. Passed House 32-26. Passed Senate 18-10. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on March 30, 2016.
- [4] Human Fetus; Embryo; Prohibited Actions (SB 1474) Prohibits the sale, experimentation, and research of aborted babies and their body parts. Passed House 41-17. Passed Senate 18-11. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on March 30, 2016.
- [5] Payroll Deductions; Charitable Contributions; Prohibition (SB 1485) Prohibits the state government from facilitating donations to the abortion industry and Planned Parenthood through the State Employee Charitable Campaign. Passed House 35-23. Passed Senate 18-11. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on March 30, 2016.
- [6] AHCCCS; Provider Participation; Exclusions (HB 2599) Empowers Arizona to take action against those who abuse taxpayer trust in the state Medicaid program such as for excessive charges, failing to report the sexual assault of a minor, and failing to segregate taxpayer dollars from abortions. Passed House 35-24.

  Passed Senate 16-13. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on May 17, 2016.
- [7] Taxpayer Protection (HB 2704) Restricts health clinics like Planned Parenthood from overcharging on prescription drugs that they obtain at a reduced price. Passed House 35-24. Passed Senate 18-12. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on May 10, 2016.
- [8] Empowerment Scholarship Accounts; Administration (SB 1280) Makes technical changes to the Empowerment Scholarship Account (ESA) program in order to allow proper management and execution of the program. Also expands the ESA program to include children of a parent who is legally blind, deaf, or hard of hearing. Passed House 33-23. Passed Senate 17-13. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on May 19, 2016.
- [9] Same-Sex Adoption and Preference for Adoption by a Married Man & Woman (Floor Amendment to SB 1536) The amendment would have repealed the Arizona law only allowing joint adoption to be by a married man and woman, thus legalizing same-sex marital adoption. The amendment would have also repealed the current preference in adoption that provides, where possible and all factors being equal, for a child to be placed with a married man and woman. Failed in Senate: 13-16. (Note that the votes listed above reflect those who aligned with CAP's position on this amendment.)
- [10] Campaign Finance System Update (SB 1516) Protects the First Amendment speech rights of individuals and organizations from overreaching government bureaucrats. Passed House 31-27. Passed Senate 18-10. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on March 30, 2016.
- [11] Free Speech on College Campuses (HB 2615) Prevents public universities and community colleges from restricting free speech to a narrow "free speech zone," and if a student's free speech rights are restricted, the student or Attorney General can now bring a legal claim against the college or university. Passed House 40-16. Passed Senate 21-8. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on May 16, 2016.
