

Pro-Life Provisions in Effect Since 2009

1. Banning partial-birth abortion (2009)
2. Establishing guidelines for judges to follow when a minor is seeking a judicial bypass to the parental consent requirements before an abortion (2009)
3. Notary requirement for parental consent (2009)
4. Granting parents the right to bring a civil claim for violations of the parental consent laws (2009)
5. Requiring informed consent (2009)
6. Expanding rights of conscience protections for healthcare workers (2009)
7. Prohibiting all non-doctors from performing surgical abortions (2009)
8. Improving abortion reporting requirements (2010)
9. Ending taxpayer-funded insurance coverage for government employees' abortions (2010)
10. Prohibiting abortion coverage on health insurance exchange (2010)
11. Prohibiting race-selection and sex-selection abortions (2011)
(Lawsuit pending but remains in force)
12. Requiring an ultrasound before an abortion (2011)
13. Banning telemedicine abortions (2011)
14. Requiring the appointment of a *guardian ad litem* for a minor seeking an abortion without parental consent (2011)
15. Updating abortion licensing statutes to include the regulation of medication abortions (2011)
16. Ending taxpayer-funded abortion training (2011)
17. Clarifying that the board of nursing does not have authority to allow nurses to perform surgical abortions (2011)
18. Prohibiting physician assistants from prescribing medication abortions (2011)
19. Requiring school presentations to present childbirth and adoption as preferred options over abortion (2012)
20. Prohibiting wrongful life and wrongful birth lawsuits (2012)
21. Requiring DHS to create a parental consent form that includes the risks of abortion (2012)
22. Requiring DHS create an informed consent website (2012)
23. Strengthening informed consent requirements for fetal conditions (2012)
24. Establishing penalties for abortion clinics that violate reporting laws (2012)
25. Disqualifying abortion providers from charitable tax credits (2012)
26. Ensuring that abortion providers must disclose internal audit results in court proceedings (2013)
27. Requiring abortion clinics to be subject to the same inspection standards as all other health care institutions (2014)
28. Establishing a penalty for individuals who help a minor avoid Arizona's parental consent requirements to obtain an abortion (2014)
29. Requiring abortion clinics report when an infant is born alive after a botched abortion and what is done to save that child's life (2014)
30. Ensuring DHS retains authority to regulate the abortion industry (2015)
31. Requiring abortion clinics to supply proof that their doctors have admitting privileges as required by law (2015) *Note: this bill also included the APR section, but that has since been rewritten*

32. Ensuring the abortion industry does not hide or withhold potentially life-saving information from women who have taken the first abortion pill but question or regret their decision (2016) *Note: APR rewrite*
33. Prohibiting the research, experimentation, and trafficking of aborted babies or their body parts (2016)
34. Protecting taxpayers from facilitating donations to abortion providers (2016)
35. Empowering Arizona regulators to disqualify Medicaid providers that bill for excessive charges, fail to report the sexual assault of a minor, or fail to segregate taxpayer dollars from abortions (2016)
36. Preventing Medicaid providers, including abortion providers, from exploiting loopholes in the system to excessively profit off taxpayers (2016)
37. Ensures that joining the medical licensure compact will not negatively impact Arizona's pro-life laws. (2016)
38. Protects the conscience rights of an employer if the entity has a sincerely held religious or moral belief. (2016)

Pro-Life Provisions Not in Effect

1. Denying abortion providers federal tax dollars that pass through the state (2012)
2. Prohibiting abortion after 20 weeks of pregnancy (2012)
3. Requiring FDA compliance for medication abortions (2012) *Note: subsequently repealed*
4. Requiring informed consent on abortion pill reversal (2015) *Note: subsequently rewritten.*
